

## Training Course Syllabus

**COURSE TITLE:** CDM Awareness

**COURSE REFERENCE:**

### **COURSE AIMS**

The key aim of CDM 2007 is to encourage health and safety into the management of projects and to encourage everyone involved to work together to:

- Improve the planning and management of projects from the start
- Identify hazards early on so they can be eliminated or reduced at the design or planning stage and the remaining risks properly managed
- Target effort where it can do the most good in terms of health and safety
- Discourage unnecessary bureaucracy

Critical to this process is having standards for competency for the key parties involved, including designers, CDM co-ordinators and contractors. To assist clients, designers, CDM co-ordinators and contractors, operating in the Highway Electrical Industry, ASLEC has produced a guidance document "Core Criteria for Assessing Contractor Competence"

This course aims to provide designers, CDM co-ordinators and contractors working within the Highway Electrical Sector with

- An awareness of the CDM 2007 Regulations and the associated HSE Approved Code of Practice.
- An understanding of individual and collective responsibilities.
- How contractor competency can be assessed.
